MILES COMMUNITY COLLEGE AG ADVANCEMENT CENTER



The Miles Community College received a \$1,000,000 anonymous donation to kick-off the Agriculture Advancement Center in Miles City, Montana. Many community businesses and residents have since followed suit with donations to make the project a reality.

The primary structure is a preengineered metal building (PEMB) of 16' sidewalls and is 29'-4" at the highest peak with interior steel stud framing. The facility includes classrooms, offices, concessions, living quarters, public restrooms, grandstands that seat 468 people, and a dirt floor arena.

The new building will provide an opportunity to increase enrollment within the Agriculture and Equine programs at Miles Community College. It will also host rodeos, banquets, trade shows and other local events.

Agriculture is the primary industry in eastern Montana. JCG is proud to be a part of such an important project for Miles Community College!

FISHING REPORT

Bitterroot River: Keep your eyes out for the Skwala hatch. Deep nymphing will be good but with the fluctuating water, don't forget a streamer!

Rock Creek: Nymphing the softer and deeper runs in the later part of the day is going to be productive. Still cold up the canyon.

Clarkfork River: Not a famous Skwala river, but they are there. Same as the Bitterroot, don't neglect to throw a streamer into the softer and deeper inside bends.

Blackfoot River: Mornings in the canyon are COLD. But as the day warms up a big dark stonefly type of nymph can be very productive on fish trying to fatten up after a long cold winter.

Missouri River: Try to stay out of the sexy water. The fish are stacked up in the deeper, slower water. Any pink nymph combo in this water will get your rod bent.

Clearwater: Steelhead are mythical creatures.

Remember: Crimp those barbs.

SAFETY BAIT—Grilling Season

CHOOSE A SAFE LOCATION—Keep grills more than 10' from all structures. Keep children and pets away. Grills should not be used on a balcony or under an overhang.

TEACH KIDS TO STAY SAFE—Make a "kid-free zone" of at least three feet around the grill. Children under five are especially vulnerable to burns from contact with a hot surface. Grill contact accounted for 37% of burns seen at emergency rooms in 2014 for children under five.

POST-GRILLING SAFETY—Keep your grill clean by removing grease buildup from grill and trays. Dispose of charcoal coals, soak them in water to extinguish. Cover the grill tightly and close all the vent.
