FISHING REPORT

Bitterroot River: The cooler temps are making this a subsurface game. Nymphing is good in the mornings, streamers in the afternoons can be a great choice.

Rock Creek: Getting cold. Nymphing in the deeper buckets can be productive with bigger, darker nymphs.

Clarkfork River: You may be able to find an afternoon midge hatch on the warmer days, but best bet would be streamers in the soft inside bends.

Blackfoot River: Big dark stonefly nymphs can be productive in the slower deeper holes. The water is getting COLD so careful wading on those wet rocks!

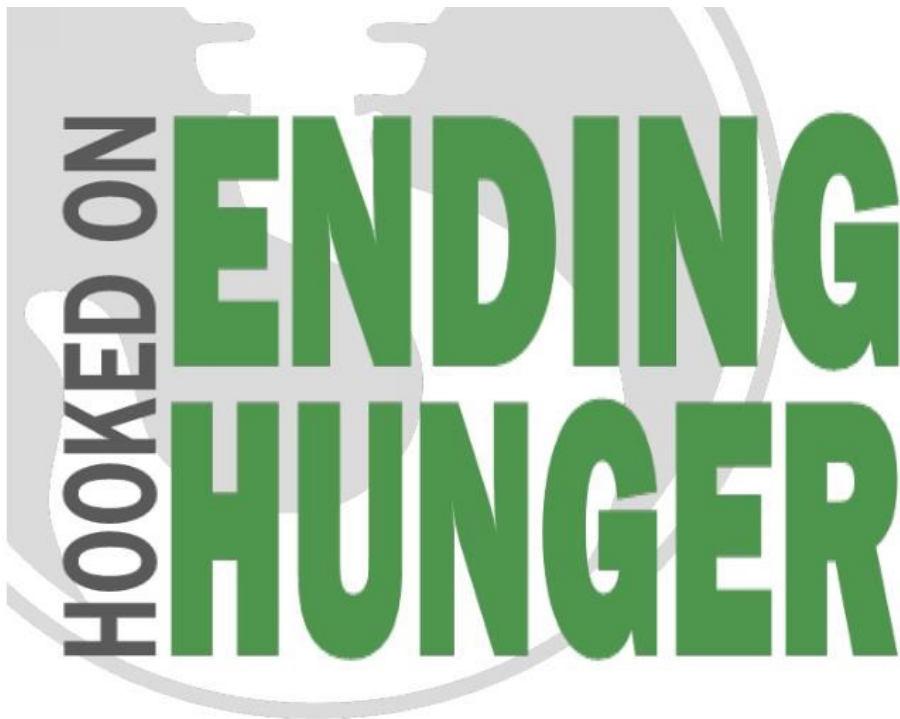
Missouri River: Streamer fishing can be HOT. Afternoons once it warms up a little is the best bet. On a really nice day you may even find some midges. But, try swinging streamers or soft hackles for the best bet.

Clearwater: Steelhead are mythical creatures.

Remember: Crimp those barbs.

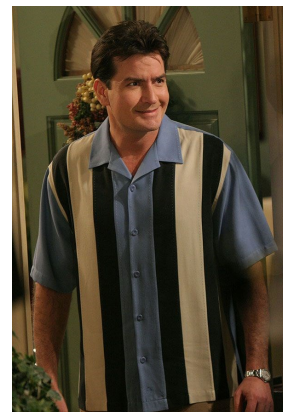

SAFETY BAIT

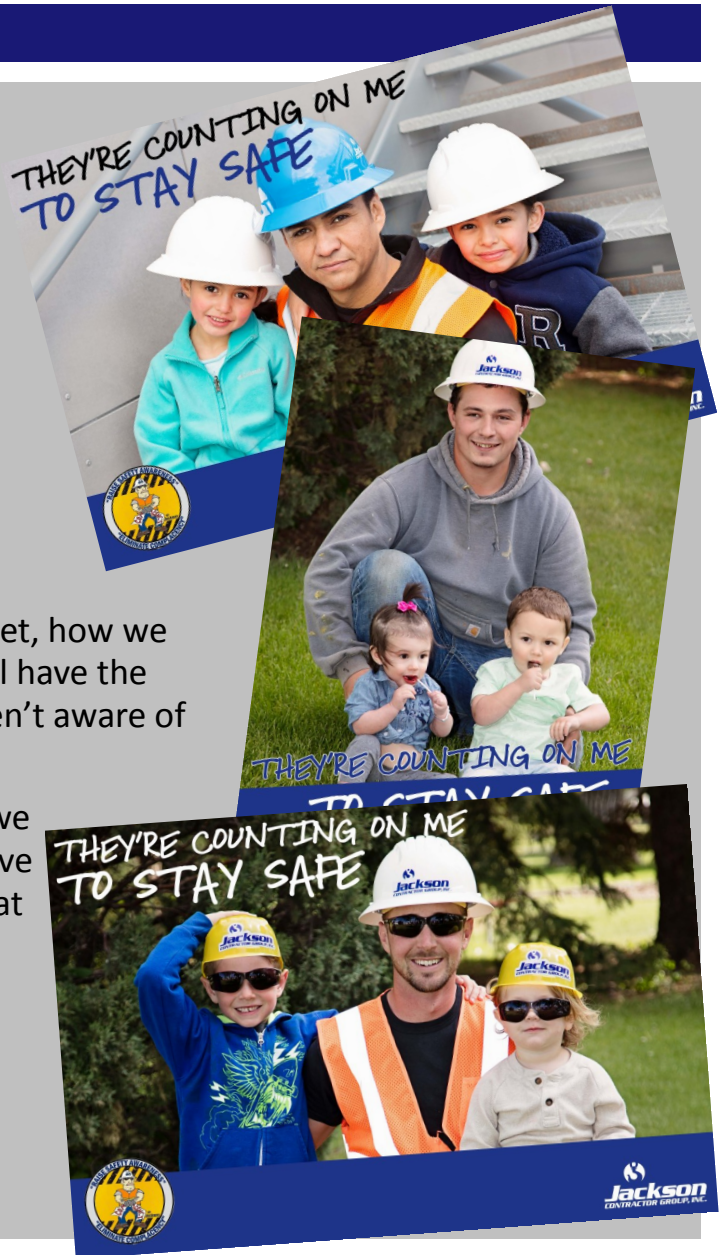
Our FIRST priority is making sure our crew gets home safe every night to their families.
